# SUPPORT NETWORK

In these complicated and challenging times, Support Network continues to provide the reassurance of financial, specialist and a range of practical assistance for IMechE members and their families.

At Support Network we like to approach each enquiry, each request for help, each situation, in an individual way. Whilst we offer a range of services and grants, we do not think that these are the only solutions, nor that 'one size fits all'. We always do our best to listen closely and to work with members and their families to find an approach to meet their specific needs. Consequently, just as no two individuals are the same, no two responses will be identical either.

Tailoring the help we provide is one of key approaches and values, as is the taking of time – time to talk, time to visit, time to work things through, and time to let our help make a difference. Our team of volunteers – all IMechE related – again provided invaluable help to other members. This peer to peer approach is no longer the norm in our sector, we are proud that this is one of our priority values – enabling members to help other members, wherever they are in the world and at whatever stage of their study or career.

Last year we introduced regular webinars on varied financial and wellbeing subjects, as a type of 'in time' approach, with popular topics including 'Food for the Mind', 'Tax Tips', 'Understanding Anxiety', all of which can still be viewed from our website archive. We did this not only to find different ways to support mental health (our counselling grant awards in 2022 were more than four times the level they were in the previous year), but to also enable members to come to the webinar subject in their own way, and at a time best suited to them – we noticed that many more viewings occurred at a different time to the live event.

Our foundation funding work initiated and progressed more STEM related projects, thereby using engineering and IMechE member support to improve lives and reach many more communities around the world. We are now working across three additional Sustainable Development Goal areas: zero hunger; gender equality and good health and wellbeing. This work will continue into 2023 with a greater focus on education projects.

Similarly in the year we commenced looking at taking an ESG (environment, social, governance) approach to our

investments and signing up to a climate change commitment.

We are always interested in receiving feedback and suggestions on what we do. Your thoughts would be most welcome.

I joined Support Network in late 2019 and from the beginning was delighted to see that we could offer more than just financial support where needed. Over the past few years we have seen a continued increase in requests for assistance from people with more

complex situations. We regularly add counselling, employment coaching, a parenting helpline, legal advice and specialist disability advocacy to our grants and loans support. It is much more effective to shape assistance in this way. In 2022 we added financial and wellbeing webinars to this support package which allow us to widen our reach and offer a preventative service.

## **INVESTING IN GLOBAL ENGINEERING FUTURES**

# SUPPORT NETWORK

The foundation funding stream of our work enables us to use our resources in a wider context to inspire and improve lives through engineering. Since expanding our charitable objectives in order to do this, we have funded organisations working in a STEM related way in the areas of international development, education, and/or engineering innovation – areas chosen to also align with the objectives of the IMechE.

During 2022 we made awards to either support second phase/follow on projects or to enter new areas and themes, including addressing aspects of climate change and making our first foundation grants in Latin America. Supported projects included:

- Enabling ocean plastic waste management through beach plastic retrieval and recycling into vacuum formed plastic products in Watamu (Kenya)
- Improving wellbeing through the construction of a school sanitation unit Tarnos School (Kenya)
- Commencing building a science laboratory at Tarnos School (Kenya) to enable enhanced STEM education
- Supporting young people into selfemployed business by establishing a motorbike repair business and micro-finance loan scheme for startups in Fort Portal (Uganda)
- Establishing educational organic vegetable growing to be used for school meals in Fort Portal (Uganda) for HIV/AIDS orphans and children in poverty
- Promoting gender equality cooperative agricultural smallholdings (Argentina)

- Protection of wetlands and promotion of environmental education in Entre Rios (Argentina)
- Enabling local communities to preserve and promote biodiversity to reduce the impacts of lithium extraction (Argentina)
- Opening new branches of disability customisation/occupational therapy charity Remap in the Centre of England region, supported by an additional Regional Coordinator (UK)

Support Network has invested in Remap as their use of engineering techniques to customise life changing solutions for people is such a close fit to our own approach - they also focus on individual needs.

Together we have helped people like Brian, a wheelchair

user, to achieve what was previously beyond them. Remap produced a raised balcony to overcome the geometrical restrictions of Brian's room, which finally helped him to enjoy his outside space.



## **MEMBERS' SUPPORT IN 2022**

## **Individual stories**

Ade approached us after a long period of homelessness following separation. He was also on sick leave from his work as an engineer surveyor due to receiving bowel cancer treatment and was only receiving state benefits as his company sick pay had expired.

We helped to find and secure a new home through providing a rental deposit and also bought essential white goods and bedroom furniture so that his young children could visit and stay over. We provided a winter warmth grant and made regular visits whilst Ade completed his treatment. Once Ade was stronger our volunteer suggested that he join a local gym to increase his social interactions. He is now on a phased return to work, and life is improving: **'Thank you for being there for me during this very tough time, l'll never forget your help.'** 

Mo reached out to us when her husband suddenly passed away. She wanted to work reduced hours to be there more for their teenage children whilst they all came to terms with their loss. We provided bereavement counselling, and also specialist parenting support when one of the children started to experience anxiety. Through this process the family realised that they felt they needed to make a fresh start and relocated to be nearer some good friends: 'Thank you for supporting us through this huge change in our lives, we are now more hopeful for the future.'
